ACADEMIC PATHWAYS

AP Institute



AP Institute is a 4-year AP pathway and a 2-year elective diploma program that allows students the opportunity to:

- develop college-level skills
- research & explore solutions to real-world issues
- collaborate & present with peers
- plan & conduct a year-long study

AVID



AVID stands for Advancement Via Individual Determination. AVID Classes are designed to prepare students to qualify and apply to four-year universities/colleges. AVID is a four (4) year program. Students enrolled in this program are required to complete weekly timed writings and analytical discourses in all subjects. In addition, students are required to make oral presentations to the class on topics related to career searches, college entrance, contemporary issues, and social concerns.

CTE



Career Technical Education (CTE) engages students in a dynamic, hands-on learning experience that results in the mastery of specific career and academic skills. CTE prepares youth and adults for a wide range of high-wage, high-skill, high-demand careers. CTE pathways provide students with the technical, academic and employability knowledge they need for success in college and beyond.

PEER COUNSELING



West Covina High School Peer Counseling I is the first course in our Wellness Program. Peer Counseling I will introduce students to the skills with self discovery as well as communication skills necessary to counsel their peers. Peer Counseling I delves into the various topics of Mental Health and Wellness. When students complete Peer Counseling I, they will be enrolled into Peer Counseling II where they serve as Peer Counselors/Mentors in our WCHS Wellness Center.

PERFORMING ARTS ACADEMY



The WCHS Performing Arts Academy (PAA) brings a high level performing arts education to a public high school. Students not only get the high quality training that a performing arts school offers but they get all of the experiences of a comprehensive high school.

Once accepted into the PAA students will work to refine their individual skills through an exclusive class, Professional Practices, exclusive opportunities and trips. In addition, students will receive private lessons/coachings and will work with a wide variety of highly professional Teaching Artists who are currently working in the performing arts industry.

DUAL ENROLLMENT



- Dual enrollment classes are college level classes that allow students to earn credit for BOTH high school and college credit.
- 10th, 11th, and 12th grade students can be enrolled in two academic institutions at once. Specifically at WCHS, we partner with Mt. San Antonio College to offer college level classes.
- We offer up to five dual enrollment courses per school year, including Accounting and Sports Medicine.
- Taking dual enrollment classes at WCHS provides students with college level studies while still allowing them to take part in the full high school experience.

AFJROTC



The overarching mission of the Air Force Junior Reserve Officer Training Corps (AFJROTC) program is to develop citizens of character. The program is built on and emphasizes the three core values of the United States Air Force: Integrity First, Service Before Self, and Excellence In All We Do.

The AFJROTC curriculum focuses on the development of values-based leaders, as well as the foundational principles and applications of air and space resources. Students are encouraged to participate in the program throughout their high school careers.

There are over 102,000 AFJROTC cadets assigned to over 850 high schools both in the United States and overseas.

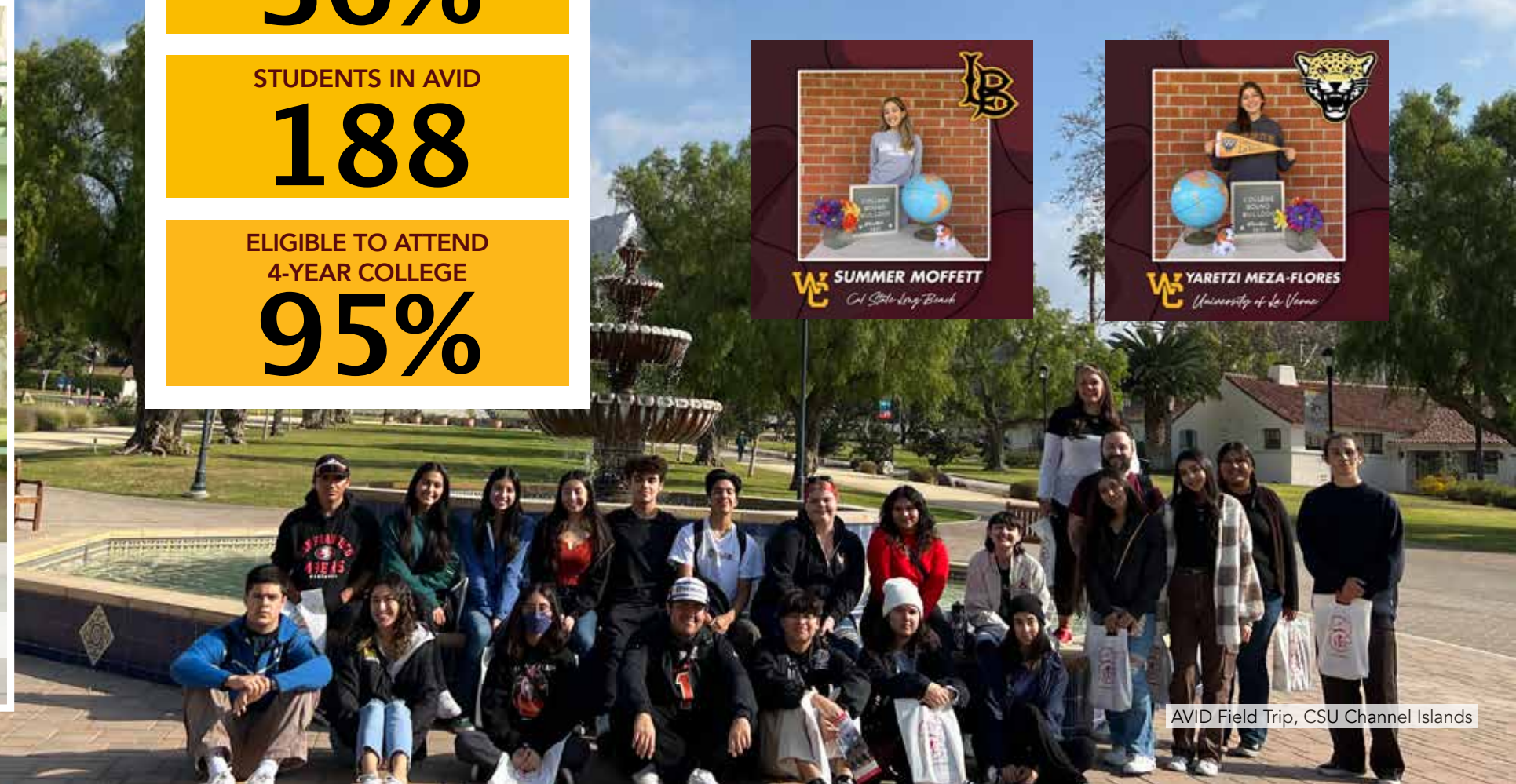
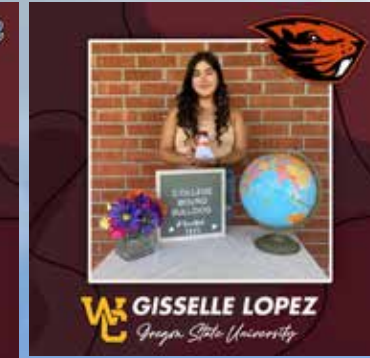

Career Technical Education (CTE) Pathways enable students to learn academic and technical skills, which helps students meet College and Career Readiness standards when they graduate from high school. Students learn transferable professional skills through project-based learning, which are aligned with CTE Model Curriculum Standards and Academic Content Standards. 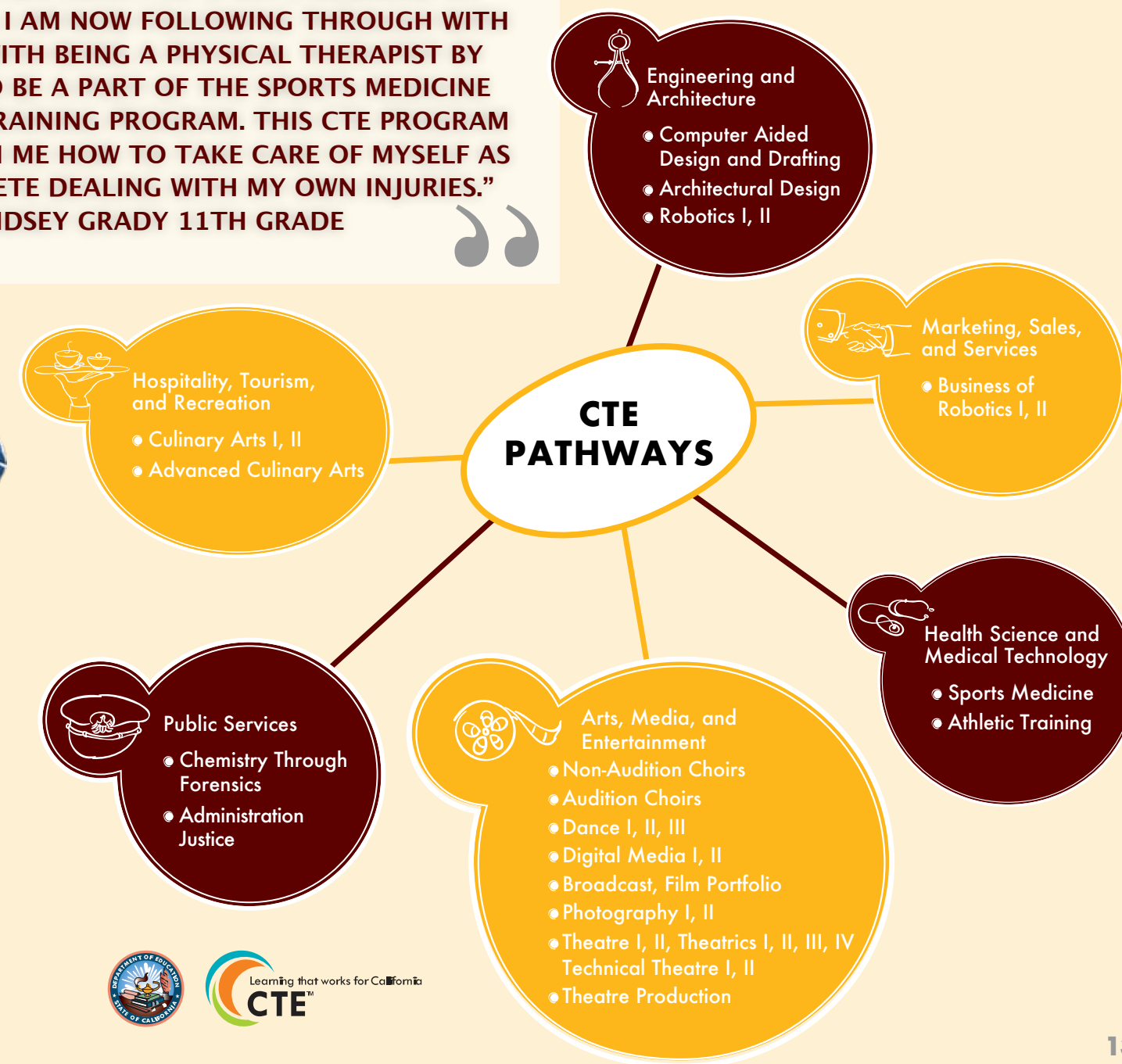

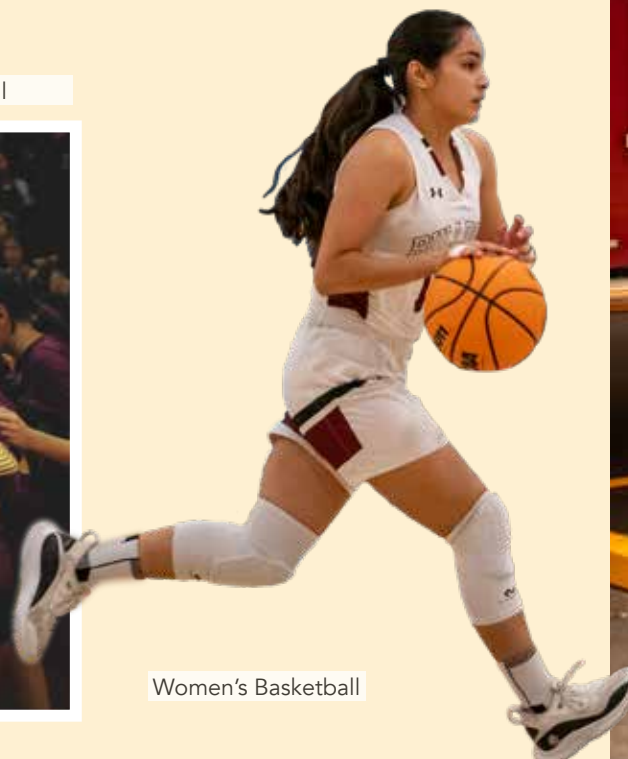

Admissions Process

Students complete the application online at WCHSpaa.org; they should include as much information as possible on the application. In addition, students will indicate which pillar (performing arts discipline) they would like to be considered for. Once submitted, the application is reviewed by our admissions team; if there are no questions from the team, the student is moved onto the audition process. ALL AUDITIONS are done ONLINE, which is a common practice of major companies and academic institutions. Once moved onto the audition process, applicants will receive an email with specific details regarding their audition.

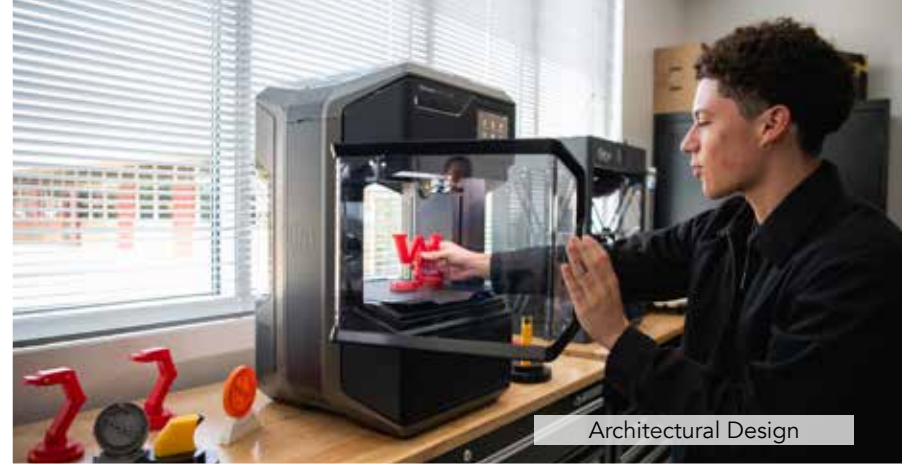

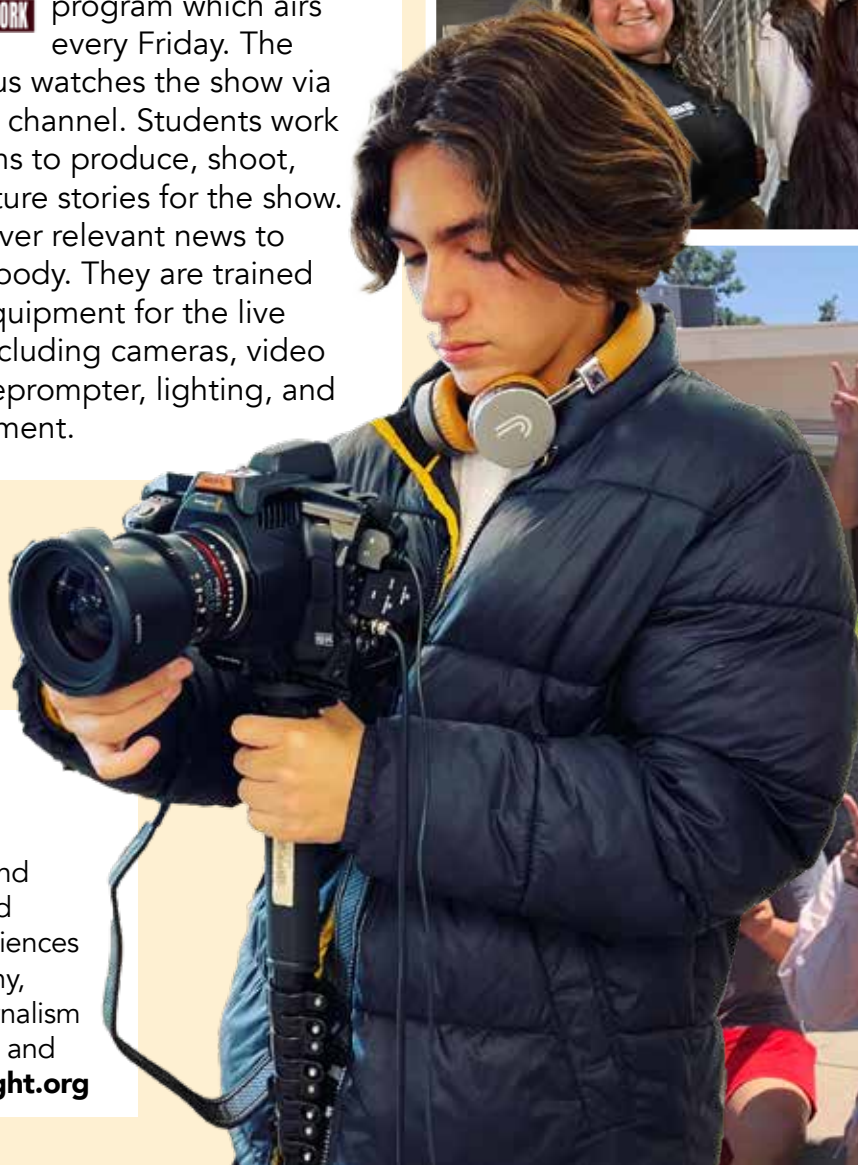

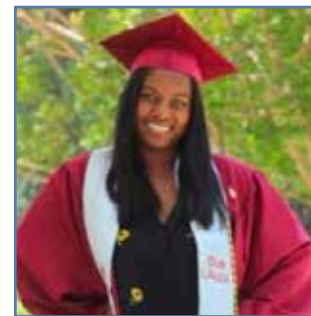
